Coller's Colorful Quarterly Quote

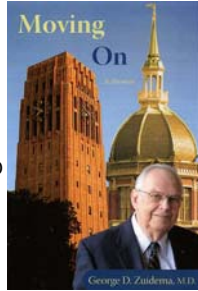
As reported by Dr. Coller's secretary August 17, 1942 and with apologies to our British colleagues:
